I think I am beginning to get the hang of the Treasurer Reports and keeping your financials in order (I still have lots to learn). I thank Tina Klein, Karin Cook (our bookkeeping) and Michelle Hagen for their patience and guidance as I learn the IFBWC accounting ropes.

The money that the IFBWC Board agreed to transfer from the Investment Fund to the newly formed Educational Foundation as been completed. This still leaves a balance in the IFBWC Investment Account of over \$300,000 so we are in very stable financial shape. However, we all need to be bringing new members into our organization so we can put this money to a viable use of "Women Helping Women". If you have ideas of a group, we can help with our Leadership University modules or other materials available to us, please let President Amanda Burk know.

It seems we are still having problems with Security Bank getting our deposits of membership dues, and any other deposits mailed directly to them, processed and the information forwarded to us so it can be updated on our membership page. The Executive Committee is once again discussing transfer of the bank account to a more updated and cooperative financial institution. With the mobile deposit option available at many banks now, our options may be more widely available. I am checking into other banks. This has been an ongoing problem for several years now. Security Bank is no longer open, to my knowledge, in Southern Illinois and most of our banks here are not available in northern Illinois. It was my pleasure to step up to award our 2021 Outstanding Working Women of Illinois Awards at this year's Leadership Conference. Our Winners submitted outstanding information and supporting document and were so deserving of this award.

Our first winner was nominated by the Mt. Vernon BWC. Monte Jo Clark

Monte Jo is a retired educator. She was previously Superintendent of Spring Garden School District and Farrington Grade School in Jefferson County. She is now an ordained minister who owns and operates the Kingdom Seed Ministries in Mt. Vernon, IL.

Her activities of Kingdom Seed include but are definitely not limited to:

The Happy Feet Program which has provided over 3,000 pair on new shoes for children returning to school. The program has been in existence for about 7 years.

She also holds a Kingdom Seed Ministries Camp each summer for youth that need a safe and fun place to be. She is very active in CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) speaking at many of their activities and rallies.

Monte Jo has held numerous Women's Conference's and has a large following under her Women's Ministries. She holds service each Sunday at the

Kingdom Seed building in Mt. Vernon. "Her work with women's empowerment is making huge changes in her community" according supporting documents of her application.

Monte Jo supports her many activities by running the Kingdom Seed Ministries café and catering business. Meals are cooked by Monte Jo and served by volunteers. She only asks for a small donation in return. She has even been known to provide meals to the homeless and those in need free of charge.

She says she wants no recognition. She just wants to be in her kitchen cooking. Which is truly one of her passions.

She is a member of the Illinois Arts Council's Advisory Board President of the Mt. Vernon Downtown Development Corporation A member of the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce and Author of 7 daily devotional books.
